








SKILL & EDUCATION



RESILIENT COMMUNITY PROJECT

The tea garden workers community displays a literacy rate of 78.85% but only 5.9% of them have studied beyond Higher Secondary level. No doubt dropout remains as high as 70.2%. The Resilient Community Project empowers and trains the adolescents at the 3 tea estates of Nahorani, Majuli and Hattigor to make informed positive decisions in life. The stakeholders as mothers, community leaders and management have been geared up to create a protection net for the children to safeguard them from abuse, exploitation, trafficking and to help them develop as productive individuals.

A drive to identify dropout children by extensively meeting the tea garden worker families and counselling children leading to rehabilitation through admission into school and vocational training has been implemented. New adolescent groups have been formed and more children have been trained with valuable life skill education.

Unfortunately for the last three months the initiative has been stalled due to lack of funds. APPLF is networking with prospective agencies in order to continue the good work.

DIGITAL LEARNING CENTRE, Latakoojan

With the drive to digitization in every facet of life and nations commitment to educate at least one individual in every Indian family to become digitally literate through NDLM, the relevance and the need for the DLC at Latakoojan has been evoked. The centre is providing Basic and Advance computer operation skills to youth completely free of cost. On completion of course the students appear for an online exam post which they are provided with certificates accredited by Microsoft. This has also created opportunity for employment of the trainees completing the course.

APPITI, Rowta

APPITI Rowta is a flagship initiative of APPLF to encounter the concern of unemployed youth of the tea tribe community and rural Assam at large. The institution is affiliated to the National Council for Vocational Training in long term as well as short term courses. Besides skilling the trainees, creating employment opportunities to generate economic sustainability in their life is the major impact that the programme has been able to instrument. Hostel facilities for the trainees in the campus, hostel for girls being the latest inclusion adds an edge to the institution.

In order to impact a broader mass of youth through skill development and employability, APPITI Rowta is replacing the long term courses by short term courses affiliated under DDU - GKY and PMKVY schemes of the Govt. of India.

Referral Hospital and Research Centre (RHRC), Chubua

Referral Hospital and Research Centre (RHRC) was established by Tata Tea at Chubua Tea Estate in 1989 with the purpose to serve as a secondary Hospital. Since then the 75 bed occupancy abled hospital has attained medical, ethical and technical sophistication to serve patients from remote corners of North Eastern states. With a dedicated crew of doctors, nurse and technicians thousands of patients are provided with services as consultation with specialists, diagnosis of ailments and required surgeries. Recent extension of services includes regular Urology consultation and a desk by Vision Spring dedicated to dispense affordable quality spectacles for patients.

eHealthcare

The eHealthcare workstations installed by HP at 5 Tea Estates of Powai, Namroop, Hathikuli, Kellyden and Dam Dim with RHRC, Chubua as the centre of the hub and spoke model has brought high end medical service to the gardens holding the hands of technology. Doctors at the estates diagnose, test and treat patients by correspondence with specialists at RHRC thus providing quality medical care without the patients having to travel miles of distance to town from their home for treatment. A latest addition has been ECHO consultations with Neurologists of Holy Family Clinic of Delhi which has elevated the efficiency of the center.

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HEALTHCARE

MEDICAL OUTREACH PROGRAMME

North Bank of Assam being one of the most remote parts of the state is in a dearth of quality medical facility. To fill in the gap a team of doctor and nurses from the Hattigor Tea Estate in the State of art Ambulance as donated by State Bank of India, visits the villages to extend medical aid to the neighboring villagers.





PROJECT PROSPER

VisionSpring in partnership with Community Eye Care Foundation and Queen's University, Belfast partnered with APPL to establish to assess the impact of near vision correction on the productivity of presbyopic pluckers in three APPL Estates, measured by weight and quality of tea picked. After screening of 1297 women and men pluckers of Kellyden, Sagmootea and Nonoi gardens, 718 workers participated in the study. This study is the first attempt to delve deep into the opthalmogical issues of the tea garden workers especially the tea pluckers.

PROJECT SAMBHUYA

APPLF in collaboration with SAATHI has initiated Project Sambhuya at the tea gardens of Assam with a vision to improve maternal and child care along with major focus on providing maternal, neonatal and family planning services.

A rapid baseline assessment of APPL tea garden Facility was conducted covering twenty-eight health facilities spread across Assam and Dooars by the SAATHII team. Along with the facilities, baseline assessment of pregnant women and adolescent girls in the community in the respective tea garden was conducted in July. ECHO session on Antenatal care have being held for the APPL health facility staff from the RHRC Chabua hub for the ECHO spokes. A total of 25 health care providers from 15 facilities have attended the session.

A skill lab was established at RHRC Chabua for conducting skills based training. Training of healthcare facilitators are being conducted to skill them with the basics skills for maternal and infant care. The start has been made with 8 nurses attending training at the skill lab.


The very first of its kind initiative has been the formation of Quality Committee which is responsible for maintaining and upgrading the quality of medical service being provided from RHRC and Tea Estate Hospitals.












ASSAM FLOOD RELIEF

Assam and floods go hand in hand in the advancing phase of South-West Monsoons. Right from the first showers in April, the rain gradually picks up intensity and by the end of July. This year's floods however have been reportedly the worst in the last 3 decades. The floods occurring in phases have affected 2500 villages displacing 17 lakh people and leaving 156 people dead. The enormity of the catastrophe drove APPLF along with its partners to extend relief measures across Lakhimpur, Majuli and Koliabor.
